What's Bard Youth Fest in Fall 2024?

- A teaching artist from Bard will introduce your students to Shakespeare's language, characters, and stories
- With the help of this Bard Teaching Artist, each participating troupe will prepare a short interpretation of excerpts from a Shakespeare play
- The Troupe will share their work in the Bard Youth Fest finale at the end of November

What will Bard provide?

- A Bard Coach: a <u>professional teaching artist</u> to facilitate rehearsals and guide your Troupe through regular sessions between October and November
- Resources: such as text, abridged scripts, games, and acting exercises
- A venue for the rehearsals and Finale showcase at the BMO Theatre Centre in Vancouver's Olympic Village

If your Troupe is from a school or community program:

Troupes will need a **Troupe Liaison**, an adult such as a teacher or other staff member, who will:

- Communicate with troupe participants and their families, school administration (if applicable), Teaching Artists, and Bard Education staff
- Create the rehearsal schedule in collaboration with the Bard Education staff
- Supervise and engage with the Troupe during all Bard Youth Fest activities
- Coordinate transportation for participants to all Youth Fest events

Timeline:

By September 15 at 11:59pm: Sign up!

October 1 to November 26: Create and rehearse!

Thursday, November 28: Attend a stage rehearsal at the <u>BMO Theatre Centre</u>. Exact times TBD.

Friday, November 29: Bard Youth Fest Finale! Troupe(s) will share their piece and celebrate the process in a showcase at <u>BMO Theatre Centre</u> on Newmont Stage. Exact times TBD.

Where will it happen?

- Rehearsals: Bard Education hosts rehearsals for the "Indie Troupe" at the BMO Theatre Centre (162 West 1st Avenue, Vancouver), on Tuesdays from 6:30pm 8:00pm. School-based troupes will rehearse at their schools. Troupes not affiliated with a school must find a space to rehearse, such as a classroom or community room.
- **Stage rehearsal & Finale:** on the Newmont Stage at the BMO Theatre Centre in Vancouver's Olympic Village.

What does it cost?

\$3,500 per troupe FREE, thanks to the generosity of the Pamela and David Richardson Family Foundation! Troupes will need to find funding to cover any transportation to the stage rehearsal, finale, and Festival production.

Our Bard Education team have many interactive, inquiry-based resources to offer you and your troupe.
