

Bard Youth Fest: Lab

What is Bard Youth Fest: Lab?

- An opportunity for young people to explore Shakespeare's language, characters and stories and create an original interpretation as a collaborative ensemble, facilitated by a professional theatre artist from Bard's teaching artist team
- Troupes will spend sessions learning various theatre-making techniques as they generate an original, short script that uses Shakespeare's text
- The Troupe will share their work in the Bard Youth Fest finale on November 29, 2025 at the BMO Theatre Centre studios.

What does Bard Education provide?

- A Bard Coach: a <u>professional teaching artist</u> to facilitate rehearsals and guide your Troupe through regular weekly sessions from October to November, 2025
- Resources such as abridged scripts, games, and acting exercises
- A venue for the creative sessions and Finale event at the BMO Theatre Centre in Vancouver's Olympic Village

If your Troupe is from a school or community program:

Troupes will need a **Troupe Liaison**, an adult such as a teacher or other staff member, who will:

- **Communicate with troupe** participants and their families, school administration (if applicable), Teaching Artists, and Bard Education staff
- Help us create the rehearsal schedule
- Supervise and engage with the Troupe during all Bard Youth Fest activities
- **Help to coordinate transportation** for participants to all Youth Fest events (stage rehearsal and finale showcase)

Timeline:

By Monday, September 22 at 11:59pm: Application deadline

October & November: Create and rehearse!

Saturday, November 29: Bard Youth Fest Finale! Troupes will stage snippets from their original pieces and celebrate each other's work at <u>BMO Theatre Centre</u> on Newmont Stage. Exact times TBD.

Where will it happen?

- Rehearsals: School-based troupes will rehearse at their schools, and community-based troupes will rehearse at their pre-arranged spaces. Bard Education hosts rehearsals for the "Indie Troupe" (troupe of individual applicants) at the BMO Theatre Centre on Tuesdays from 6:30pm 8:30pm.
- **Stage rehearsal & Finale:** on the Newmont Stage at the BMO Theatre Centre in Vancouver's Olympic Village.

What does it cost?

\$3,500 per troupe Participation in this program is **FREE**, thanks to the generosity of the Pamela and David Richardson Family Foundation!
